## #MasksforSpearfish - Kids Masks Thank you for participating!

Please wash (hot water) and dry (high heat) all fabric before sewing to avoid shrinking. Colors may bleed, so wash separately or use a color catcher. You may need to press fabric. Let us know if you need additional sewing supplies (thread, pins, machine needles, etc.).

## Kids Face Mask Requirements:

- Minimum of 2 layers of 100% high-quality quilters cotton (thick enough to not see light through)
- Filter pocket may be included, but is not necessary
- A sleeve/pocket for a nose bridge can be included, but please don't sew in a wire as they don't hold up in the laundry and result in sharp edges
- Fabrics need to be appropriate for young kids attending school and not distracting simple texture/patterns or solids, gender-neutral preferred
- Ear loops are preferred to ties. Loops can be made from thin strips of knit fabric or soft elastic.
- Oversize the ear loops and make them adjustable (plastic pony bead, silicone cord lock, or loose knot) to fit a wider variety of faces
- If using a fabric strip for a tie, include a bead or toggle to secure
- Sizes for kids' masks should fit children in grades K-5 or in middle school.
